



Jesus publicly, the same Peter, who along with the others will barricade themselves behind locked doors out of fear, before Peter can be transformed by what he has received and what he has witnessed.

And it's the same for us, us fools as well. If we want to live in the way Jesus invites us to live, to love another, to wash each other's feet, to live as each other's servants, to love sacrificially, there's no amount of good will or good intention that by itself will allow us to live this way. The only way to live as people of Jesus' new commandment is to be a people who know what it is to have received the love of Jesus on the cross for ourselves personally.

Until we can confess that Jesus is our Lord, that he is our Master and Saviour, and that the one who is our Saviour has loved us to death, loved me to death, even death on the cross, we will not be able to live as Jesus intends. And yes, it will seem foolish to the world around us. The Apostle Paul put it well years later when he wrote to the church in Corinth, "but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength."

Now is a time for the followers of Jesus to love as he has loved us. Now is a time for those who are Christ's disciples to serve as we have been served by our Lord and Master. There are those who are easy to love, those closest to us, family, friends, loved ones. Then there are those for whom for us to love is neither easy nor difficult, just somewhat ambivalent. But then there are those who are hard, difficult, maybe even verging on for us, impossible to love. And yet we remember that Judas was in that room when Jesus washed the disciples' feet, just as Peter was. And we remember that Jesus didn't die on the cross only for some but for all. His love on the cross made it possible for all people, even the worst among us, to find redemption and restoration, forgiveness and peace, if we will accept God's grace and mercy, if we will say yes to God's love.

I know it won't be easy to live this way, to love this way. But as Jesus says, there is a way that people will know that we are his disciples, if we will love one another, if we will love as he has loved us. If the church is a community of God's good news, then we have no option but to love, to express compassion, to be merciful, to serve, to model a different approach, one that even might get us labeled as foolish. It won't be everyone's way, but it is our way. And before we start getting on our knees, let's make sure we have received what it is we hope to be giving away. Let's make sure that we are intimately familiar with Jesus' love so that we can open ourselves to loving one another.
