Bio: Dr. Dutcher-Walls is Professor of Hebrew Scripture at VST. In addition to teaching, she is also the Dean, giving administrative oversight to student programs and services, the Registrar's Office and the Diversified Education programs, and the school's relationships with sessional lecturers, guest lecturers, and other contractual teaching staff. A life-long Presbyterian, she was ordained by the United Presbyterian Church (USA) in 1978 and now is a minister in the Presbyterian Church in Canada. With a love of teaching, she has led numerous adult education courses, retreats, continuing education courses, and lay education courses. Recent lectures include topics such as "Prophets, Psalmists and Sages: Poetic Analysis Skills for Preaching" and "A Biblical Approach to Full Inclusion." She has been active in the church through preaching, social justice ministries, part-time congregational leadership, and campus chaplaincy. She is married to a Lutheran minister and has two adult children and enjoys reading science fiction and gardening.

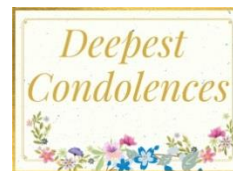


Annual Congregational Meeting
