- The name recorder comes from the Latin, *recordari*, meant to remember. Recorders were historically used to teach birds to whistle tunes!
- Recorders range from the 9-inch soprano to the impressive 8-foot contrabass recorders.
 - They can be made from wood, ivory, or plastic.
 - King Henry VIII was a devoted fan, possessing 76 recorders!
 - In Italy, the recorder is known as flauto dolce, which translates to “sweet flute.”
